



Integrating Library Resources into Canvas



- Quizzes

Embedding Video

Available for *Films On Demand* and *Academic Video Online (AVON)*.

1. Select App (plug icon) and pick **Films On Demand** or **Alexander Street (AVON)**.
If you don't see the plug icon, click on the vertical 3 dots More menu.
2. Search for video by keyword(s).
3. Embed video.
